When the *Quantum of the Seas*, the latest and greatest cruise ship from Royal Caribbean, left Singapore I was on board for a three day cruise! Rod Stewart’s “I am sailing, I am sailing” came to mind, but the line “I’m all at sea where no-one can bother me” by Jamie Cullum more accurately summed up my mood as I inspected my stateroom. Not bad at all - lucky 13th Deck!

Boarding the ship had been quick and easy, finding a seat for lunch was a bit more of a challenge, but the food at Windjammer Marketplace was excellent. My next objective - get my bearings and find my way around!

The cruise industry has undergone many a change; it is no longer primarily a means of transport to get from A to

B. As we say in Singapore it’s a floating casino! Oops sorry it’s a floating integrated resort! I was surprised to find out how much there is to do besides eat, drink and gamble on *Quantum of the Seas*.

Two of the most popular attractions on board are the Flowrider surfing simulator and the Ripcord skydiving simulator. You can also ride a bumper car, use the gym, take part in quizzes, ballroom dance or disco and so on!

After a dinner at Chic and a couple of drinks I slept soundly. I was eating breakfast as we sailed into Port Klang Malaysia. I stayed on board rather than making the journey into KL.

“Like A Bridge Over Troubled Waters.”

Actually the sea was very calm, not troubled at all. There were bigger waves at Kallang Stadium for the SEA Games that were happening when the Quantum of the Seas had sailed into Singapore for the first time. The ship was so stable it was difficult to tell we were moving.

One of the great things about being an invited guest is that you get to go behind the scenes or, in this case, up to the bridge to meet Captain Srecko Ban and his officers. The bridge is very spacious, totally hi-tech with the latest computers and software, but yes they still keep a lookout using binoculars too!

We also got to see the galleys of the ship. A lot of work goes into the feeding of the 5,000. More than five loaves and two fishes! In fact over 10,000 slices of pizza were served in three days.

Did I forget to mention that the Quantum of the Seas has bars? There are plenty of bars and drinking buddy Justin and I and Fred and Carol (who were spending an amazing 50 days on board - and only had carry-on luggage with them!!) sampled a few of the beers, wines and cocktails - all in the course of duty! There is even a Bionic Bar where a robot mixes the cocktails.

Special thanks to the guys in Michael’s Genuine Pub and Ms Ting and Edmund in Vintages for being friendly and informative. Surprisingly, the bars were almost empty, but the casino and restaurants were packed!

After dinner at the excellent American Icon Grill restaurant, a few more drinks and a supper of fabulous pizza at Sorrento’s and Day 2 was over.

Determined to make the most of my last full day at sea I was up bright and early.

Yet again I ignored the casino and the designer shops, chickened out of the North Star cable car 90 metre ride over the sea and skipped the Xbox, but enjoyed a lively game of table tennis and a stroll around the deserted deck. A 12-night one-way cruise in June 2016 from Singapore to Ho Chi Minh City (Phu My), Hong Kong, Xiamen, Seoul (Incheon) and ending in Tianjin. In 2016, Royal Caribbean is bringing more of the Quantum experience to cruisers in Asia.
